SIR ISAAC NEWTON'S TEN COMMANDMENTS

as Recorded by His Servant, Dr. Itai Seggev

- 1. Thou shalt draw thy free-body diagram for each object in the problem.
- 2. Thou shalt pick a sensible coordinate system.
- 3. Thou shalt write down Newton's second law in components and, if necessary, the torque equation $(\sum \tau = 0 \text{ or } \sum \tau = I\alpha)$ for each object in the problem.
- 4. Remember thy sign conventions to keep your equations consistent.
- 5. Honor thy Professor and thy Grader.
- 6. If thou hast more unknowns than equations, thou shalt look for additional relationships from kinematics or geometry.
- 7. Thou shalt identify the desired quantity and solve for it symbolically.
- 8. Thou shalt plug in the numbers at the end.
- 9. Thou shalt include units with every number.
- 10. Thou shalt gaze upon thy final answer to determine if it is at all reasonable. If it is not, thou shalt repeat this process.
